[b 31 July 1834 at Alfred, NY; d 31 Dec. 1919 at Shinglehouse, PA] Elisha P. Fenner *m* 1st Elizabeth Hall [d 17 Apr. 1858] on 1 Jan. 1857. Elizabeth Hall died seven days after giving birth to Ellery. He *m* 2nd Harriet Smith [b 7 Apr. 1837; d 3 Apr. 1915] of Alfred, NY, on 28 Sept. 1867. Elisha served in the Civil War. He enrolled as a private in Capt. Ellsworth's Company of Steuben Rangers, 10 Sept. 1861, later known as Company D, 86th NY Infantry. From 28 Feb. 1862 to 28 Feb. 1863, he served with the Signal Corps. He was promoted to Sgt. Major on 20 Mar. 1863. Elisha re-enlisted as a veteran on 20 Dec. 1863 and was made Hospital Steward 14 Nov. 1864. He was commissioned as 1st Lieutenant 1 June 1865 to 27 June 1865, but was mustered out as an officer on account of deafness, which he had acquired as a result of exposure to continuous cannonading. Although he fought in many battles, the Gettysburg campaign made the most vivid and lasting impression on him. In 1874, Elisha went into the cheese manufacturing business, and by 1896, he was operating four cheese factories.

Uncle John Fenner Dead

He Tore Down the Old South Church and Was Otherwise Famous.

Benjamin S. Fenner, one of the best known characters of Worcester, died at his boarding house, 5 Bigelow Court, yesterday. He had been ailing for some time and was confined to the house for several days, but he was not thought to be seriously sick until he was suddenly stricken with apoplexy, and expired in spite of attempts to revive him.

"Uncle John" as he was familiarly called, was 71 years of age, and was a native of North Scituate, R.I. He came to Worcester some 50 years ago. He was a machinist years ago, but gave up his trade to drive a job wagon. He became particularly prominent by taking the contract for removing the Old South Church from the Common in 1887. His experiences with the old church and its historic rooster would fill a book. He used the material in building what was known as the ark on Southgate Street, a building devoted to tenements, excepting for space devoted to a dance hall. It was a losing venture financially.
